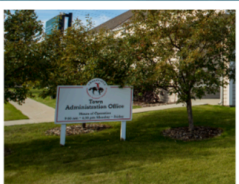

## HOW ARE PROPERTY TAXES CALCULATED?

The amount of property tax you pay is based on the assessed value of your property. Assessment values for 2026 are based on the provincially legislated valuation date of July 1, 2025, and the physical condition of a property as of December 31, 2025. The assessed value of your home can vary widely from today's market value.

## PROPERTY ASSESSMENT COMPLAINTS

As a taxpayer you have comprehensive rights to information and due process. An assessed person is entitled to see or receive sufficient information about their property in accordance with the Municipal Government Act section 299, or a summary of an assessment in accordance with Section 300, or both.

**If you are the assessed person and would like more information regarding your assessment, please contact our office at 403-946-5565 or email [receivables@crossfieldalberta.com](mailto:receivables@crossfieldalberta.com).**

An assessor can review your assessment and provide an explanation specific to your property. If you have spoken with an assessor and still feel that your property assessment is incorrect, you may file a complaint with the Municipality.

Complaints can only be filed against the assessed value of the property, not against the taxes or tax rates.

**The deadline to file a complaint is Monday, July 13, 2026.**

# WORLD WATER WEEK AUGUST 23-27



## HOW MUCH WATER ARE YOU USING? Tips and tricks for water conservation

Want a lush green lawn?  
Watering your lawn 3 times a week, at dawn or dusk, for 20 minutes each time is sufficient!

Keeping your grass longer will shade the soil from the sun, keeping it cool & reducing the need for watering.

Restrict outside water usage to even-numbered addresses on even calendar days, and odd-numbered addresses on odd calendar days.

WATER



Washing your car at home uses approx. 492 liters of water, while a car wash uses approx. 105 liters. A car wash also protects chemical run off from entering into storm drains.

Turning off the tap while you are doing dishes, brushing your teeth, or shaving can save thousands of liters of water every year!

On average, an energy-star dishwasher uses **7 liters of water to wash around 72 items**. Hand washing the same number of items requires 50 liters of water.

### Take the toilet test!

**DROP:** Drop a toilet tab into the tank of your toilet. Wait 2-3 min.  
**PEEK:** If the water in your bowl changes color, you have a leak.  
**REPAIR:** Repair or replace your leaky toilet.



### Did you know?

The Town owns and maintains **30+ km of water lines**

The Town distributes over **485,200 cubic meters of water annually**. That's the equivalent of 155 Olympic sized swimming pools!

The Town owns and maintains **135 + Fire Hydrants** that support fire suppression efforts

### Can I park my RV or trailer in town? YES!

Here are some things to keep in mind if you bring an RV or trailer into town:

- Trailers parked on a street must be attached to a vehicle at all times
- A trailer or RV may be parked on a street for up to 72 consecutive hours (3 days). After 72 hours, it must be relocated for a minimum of 24 hours before returning to the same location.
- Vehicles or trailers parked for more than 72 hours may be deemed abandoned and are subject to enforcement action, including towing.

Reminder: Your trailer is considered a vehicle and is subject to the same parking regulations

# BYLAW BRIEF

As we enter the peak of summer here are important updates to help keep our community clean, safe and beautiful for everyone.

## 1. Summer yard maintenance: Grass and weeds

Please remember that under the Town’s Community Standards Bylaws Section 3

- b) “every occupant or owner of a property shall eradicate and control dandelions and noxious weeds and plants on your property, including any boulevard, lane or alley on your property.”
- c) “ensure the grass or other vegetation on the property is cut so it does not grow to a height of 15cm/6 inches or more”.

## 2. Wildlife awareness: Coyotes

Although the recent coyote sightings within town limits may cause concern, we can reduce the risk of conflicts by working together and taking appropriate precautions.

- Keep your cats indoors.
- Keep your dogs on a secure leash when out for walks.
- If you encounter an aggressive coyote, or spot one within town limits please report to Fish and Wildlife (My Wild Alberta) by calling the Report-A-Poacher line at 1-800-642-3800. And email the Town Bylaw Officer at [peaceofficer@crossfieldalberta.com](mailto:peaceofficer@crossfieldalberta.com). This will allow us to record sightings, keep the community safe and liaison with the Fish and Wildlife Officers, to best manage the situation.

## 3. On Leash Dogs

It has been brought to our attention that there has been an increase in off leash dogs. The Crossfield Dog Park is a designated off leash area for dogs. All dogs must be kept on a leash and be secured in all other areas within the town. This is for the safety of the dog, other animals and people in the area. Help make the community safe and enjoyable for everyone by following the dog control bylaws.

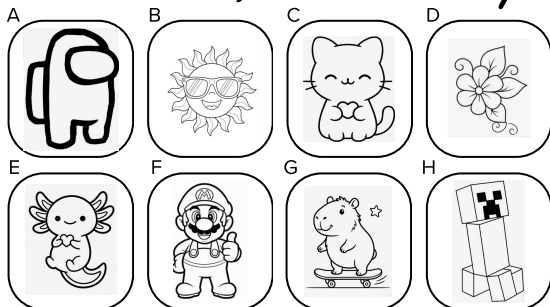
