



48th Annual Pete Knight Rodeo Days go off without a hitch

Crossfield's annual rodeo celebrations were held June 13 and 14 with numerous activities for all ages throughout town.

Kicking the weekend off was a free pancake breakfast and musical performance hosted by the Town of Crossfield. Musician Lachlan Neville, hailing from Rocanville, SK, dazzled a crowd of around 500 breakfast-goers who enjoyed free pancakes, eggs, ham and coffee. Following the breakfast, Kal Tire hosted nearly 300 people for their free lunch serving drinks, treats, and hamburgers prepared by SMS Plastics/SMS Smokers & Grills.

The FCA rodeo performance was hosted by the Crossfield Rodeo Society with began at 6 pm on Friday evening followed by a Saturday 2 pm showing. A dance followed both rodeo

performances with entertainment by Steve Pointmeyer and band leading into the early morning hours. Saturday evening's events also saw a spectacular showing of fireworks.

Prior to Saturday's performance at the rodeo grounds, the Crossfield Ag Society served an additional free pancake breakfast from the Pete Knight Arena to the community in partnership with the Crossfield & Madden Food Bank. The grateful food bank reported donations to the tune of \$1,200 which will help numerous families within Crossfield.

Saturday also saw the return of the Pete Knight Parade which weaved through the streets of Crossfield lead by parade marshalls and members of a family that have called the area

It's finally RV and campfire season!



● Can I park my RV on the street?

Nothing cures the winter blues like a road trip with the trailer in tow. Load and unload your camper conveniently in front of your house! Yes, your RV can be parked on the street.

Some things to keep in mind:

- The RV must be attached to your vehicle at all times.
- It is permitted to be on the street for up to 48 hours at which time it must be moved for a minimum of 48 hours.
- It can only be parked in front of your property.



● What are the rules for having a fire?

Quick hot dog supper? S'mores for the kids? A catch up with friends after a long week? Nothing beats sitting around a fire.

Some things to keep in mind:

- Fire pits must be no more than 1 m (3') wide and be less than .6 m (2') high.
- Ensure your fire pit is at least 3 m (10') from any buildings, property lines, or combustible materials.
- Fires must have a spark arrestor/screen.

Information Alert

Distraction Thefts

Throughout Alberta, the RCMP has received several reports in relation to gold scammers. On numerous occasions, scammers have been identified as being from Romania. The modus operandi (MO) of the group includes:

- Victims are often approached in parking lots or flagged down on the side of the highway;
- Scammers claim they need money for gas, food and/or air tickets to get home in exchange for gold jewellery, which is found to be fake;
- Victims are sometimes accompanied by the scammer to banks to withdraw more cash

from ATMs and/or stores to purchase gift cards;

- In some cases, scammers use distraction techniques to steal real gold jewellery off victims (watches, rings and necklaces), and replace with fake gold jewellery;
- Scammers have also entered businesses and distracted staff members to steal items such as jewellery;
- Women and children are sometimes inside the scammer's vehicle;
- Scammers also are known to converse about the death of a

family member and/or use praying or blessing gestures;

- Scammers often operate rental vehicles and/or vehicles with out-of-province license plates (Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia). Vehicles are frequently exchanged between scammers;
- Scammers have been known to fraudulently register vehicles in Alberta using the address of an innocent homeowner whom they do not know.
