At the Organizational Meeting on October 28, Council appointed Deputy Mayor Gustafson and assigned members to various boards and committees to support effective governance and community representation.



Are you facing challenges and are looking for support to get connected to programs and services? Our Information and Referral Program can help. This Program can be accessed in-person by appointment at the Airdrie Office during business hours. Phone service is available by calling toll free to

1-866-945-3905. We provide outreach services in Beiseker, Crossfield and Irricana. Support Services will be partnering with various community groups in Crossfield with the goal of increasing in-person services to you.

Support Services staff provide information, supported referrals, and advocacy to help community members connect to services and programs within Community Links, within your community, or from Government. The program is designed to empower community members to identify their specific needs and build knowledge and problem-solving skills to address challenges now and in the future.

In partnership with the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program, community members with a modest income and simple tax situation can have their income tax completed at no cost.
